Lesson 1. Sketch Your Painting

- 1. Position your paper
- 2. Draw the horizon line
- 3. Draw the structures and clothesline
- 4. Draw the clouds
- 5. Draw the trees
- 6. Draw in the details

Lesson 2. Painting the Sky and Foreground

- 1. Paint water in the clouds
- 2. Paint blue around the clouds
- 3. Paint the foreground
- 4. Add grassy shapes to the foreground

Lesson 3. Painting Trees, Roofs, and Shadows

- 1. Paint the trees on the left and in front
- 2. Paint trees on the right

- 3. Paint the roof of the barn and shed
- 4. Paint the house roof
- 5. Paint the shadows on the sides of the houses and silo

Lesson 4. Details, Details, Details

- 1. Paint the sides of the barn
- 2. Paint doors and windows
- 3. Paint the shadows under the roof
- 4. Add detail to barn and silo
- 5. Add branches to trees
- 6. Add grass details
- 7. Erase pencil lines
- 8. Sign your painting

- 1. Frame it and Create your own art Collection!
- 2. Make prints, mat them, and give them away as gifts!
- 3. Make Card size prints and send them to family and friends!
- 4. Display it in an art show!

Brush Storage and Care Tips

- → While brushes are not made to last forever, good care can help significantly to extend their lifetime.
- → Brushes should always be stored flat and should never be stored with the brush part down because that would misshape the brush hairs.
- → To clean brushes, dip and swirl them in water and get all the paint of and wipe off the excess and reshape the head with a paper towel. Allow the brush to dry.
- → Do not store brushes in cramped quarters; bending hairs out of shape.
- → Try not to soak handles. Dry handles after every cleaning.
- → Clean immediately after painting.
- → Do not let any paint sit or dry in the hairs.
- → Course scrubbing can permanently damage the hairs and force paint into the ferrule.
