

# QUICK START GUIDE Lesson Guide

### Lesson 1. Sketch Your Painting, Apply Masking Fluid

- 1. Draw the top mountain ridge line (make sure paper is horizontal and rough side up). Draw mountains to the right.
- 2. Draw the blue mountain off the center of the page.
- Draw the second mountain line on the left.
- 4. Draw the third mountain line on the left.
- 5. Draw the edge of the field line and the little hill on the right.
- Draw the clouds.
- 7. Draw the Aspen trees.
- Draw the pine trees and tree line for autumn trees.
- 9. Apply masking fluid (using a little paintbrush)

## Lesson 2. Paint the Sky, Field, and Mountains

- 1. Paint the sky.
- 2. Paint the first layer of the field.
- 3. Add layers to the field
- 4. Paint the Purple Mountain

- 5. Paint left lower ridge
- 6. Paint the blue mountain and right upper ridge
- 7. Paint the left middle ridge and right pink hill

### Lesson 3. Paint Autumn Trees, Foreground Details, Pine Trees

- 1. Paint background foliage
- 2. Paint the Pine Trees
- 3. Add detail to the trees and grass
- 4. Remove dried masking fluid

### Lesson 4. Paint Shadows on Aspen Trees, Add Details

- Paint shadows on Aspen trees
- Paint branches on trees.
- 3. Paint little dark spots on trees.
- 4. Paint yellow leaves.
- 5. Add final details
- 6. Sign it!

### What can you do with your Painting?

- 7. Frame it and Create your own art collection!
- 8. Make prints, mat them, and give them away as gifts!
- Make Card size prints and send them to family and friends!
- 10. Display it in an art show!

#### **Brush Storage and Care Tips**

- → While brushes are not made to last forever, good care can help significantly to extend their lifetime.
- → Brushes should always be stored flat and should never be stored with the brush part down because that would misshape the brush hairs.
- → To clean brushes, dip and swirl them in water and get all the paint of and wipe off the excess and reshape the head with a paper towel. Allow the brush to dry.
- → Do not store brushes in cramped quarters; bending hairs out of shape.
- → Try not to soak handles. Dry handles after every cleaning.
- → Clean immediately after painting.
- Do not let any paint sit or dry in the hairs.
- → Course scrubbing can permanently damage the hairs and force paint into the ferrule


